Personal Camping Equipment Checklist

Scouts must wear their official Boy Scout shirts and neckerchiefs while traveling. Class A or Class B uniforms may be worn on the trail. Names should be put in all scout clothing for identification purposes in an out of view area. Pants may be worn long or short depending on the weather. Troop sweatshirt is well suited as evening wear on troop outings.

Required Equipment

Sleeping pad
Plastic Ground cloth
Sweater or Sweatshirt
Light weight jacket
Hiking Boots or sturdy tennis shoes
Poncho or rain coat
1 change of underwear per night
1 extra T-shirt per night
2 extra pair of socks
1 Change of long pants
towel
25' of nylon cord and 6 clothes pins
Flashlight (with fresh batteries)
2- 1L water bottle
Pocket knife
Wool cap and gloves
2 lg plastic trash bags (33 gal size)
Vittle Kit

Toilet kit, including:
toothbrush, toothpaste
deodorant
small bar of soap
small washcloth
small sewing kit
small roll of toilet paper

Personal first aid kit
6 band aids
tape and gauze
antiseptic cream
chapstick
sunscreen (small tube)
personal medication
matches (in waterproof case)
moleskin or molefoam
whistle (optional)

Troop equipment to be carried by all

part of a tent
some of the food
some of the cooking gear (stove, fuel,
pots and pans)

Optional Equipment

Watch
Compass
Camera & Film
Sunglasses
Pillow and foam pad
Small container of candy
swim suit

Restricted Equipment (DO NOT BRING)

Cell phones, sheath knives, axes, fireworks, weapons, propane heaters, radios & electronic games, drugs and alcohol. If you travel with a walkman or electronic game it will be stored in a locked car at the trail head.
